AFTERNOON AT THE SEASIDE BY AGATHA CHRISTIE

Three couples are spending some time in their beach huts at Little-Slippyng-on-Sea. A theft has taken place at a nearby luxury hotel where Lady Beckman has had an emerald necklace stolen from her room. Only a siren in a bikini, making the men ogle and the women envious, can distract the visitors from their speculation. So who did it, and who will solve this otherwise perfect crime?

True to form, Agatha Christie has given us a play with some really great character roles, from the talkative and generally cynical Mrs Crum, the possessive old battle-axe Mrs Gunner and her hen-pecked son Percy, the charming and rakish Bob Wheeler, guaranteed to be the life and soul of any gathering, to a number of other roles you would typically find at the seaside, making up the cast of 12 familiar CLT faces.

CLT first performed *Afternoon at the Seaside* in 1990 and amazingly, one member of the original cast from 27 years ago will reprise their role in this production!

Local professional theatre company, LynchPin Productions, will be performing **ROTTEN PERFECT** by local playwright and actor, Claire Parker, directed by Kate Napier, as part of the bicentenary celebration of G.F. Watts's birthday.

ROTTEN PERFECT is a witty insight into the impassioned back-stage lives of Henry Irving and Ellen Terry, King and Queen of the Victorian stage. Life is complicated at the Lyceum Theatre in 1890s London. Henry Irving is doing everything he can to keep his theatre up and running and to keep his star actress, the famous Ellen Terry, happy (who at age 16 was briefly married to G.F. Watts). Rehearsals are under way. Henry needs a success. Ellen watches impatiently. When it's her turn with the great man himself on stage, there's a subtext of longing and desire. They have a history. But they're both married to other people and are now merely professional colleagues. Aren't they? Tired of the classics, will Ellen be lured by that upstart George Bernard Shaw to seek new and challenging roles elsewhere?

➤ There have been a number of **accidents** (two this year) at the same spot in The Street, by Puck’s Oak Barn and The Limes. Highways have assessed the road and can see no structural defect that might be causing the problem. A sign warning vehicles to SLOW DOWN is being considered. Data from the VAS (flashing 30 mph sign) suggests that speed has increased, as well as overall volume, in both directions, the latter being in contrast to information given to us by Surrey County Council and used as part of the evidence base for the Local Plan. To provide independent evidence of the volume and speed of the traffic, a private company has been approached to provide this data.

WANBOROUGH GREAT BARN

During WW2, the Special Operations Executive (SOE) took over the Manor House in Wanborough and ran training school STS5 for their agents, who were then sent behind enemy lines. For Heritage Open Days this year, on Saturday 9th and Sunday 10th September, there will be the opportunity to understand more about the role of one of the most famous agents who passed through Wanborough: **NOOR INAYAT KHAN**. The Barn will be open from 2pm to 5pm each day. *Wanborough Heritage Café will be open in Wanborough Village Hall on both days from 11am to 5pm for morning coffee, afternoon tea, tasty lunches and homemade cakes.*

● **THE RICHMOND DOG SHOW** will be held in Forge Meadow, Loseley, from Friday 8th to Sunday 10th September. The Richmond Championship Show is one of the oldest established and best known dog shows in the UK calendar and entries are received from all over the British Isles, The Republic of Ireland and Continental Europe. More than 150 breeds can be seen over the course of each show and the top awards are keenly contested.



Members of the public are admitted free of charge and there is a charge, payable on arrival at the venue, of £10 for use of the public car parking facilities. The entrance is from New Pond Road and the show opens at 7.30am daily. The public may bring their own dogs to the show provided they enter them on arrival as "spectator" dogs, for which a fee of £5 per dog is payable, and they agree to complete and sign a written undertaking to keep their dog(s) under control at all times. *Full details are available at <http://richmonddogshow.org.uk/index.php>*

SURREY CHURCHES RIDE & STRIDE
